## CHILDREN'S PRAYER LEAFLET: LENT, A TIME OF BLESSINGS (FEBRUARY 2023)

Lent is a time of many blessings. Children too are called to live Lent well. For, through Lent and Easter, God renews his blessings and a blessing is like a shower of gifts, it is a special time when we receive God's attentions in a special way. God fills us with gifts. God, after having given us everything, gives us his crucified Son: the greatest of blessings, the most precious gift. Through the cross of Christ, we receive eternal life.

The Lord God promises us blessings, and this Lent prepares us for them. Let the children not neglect this Lenten period as it is an opportunity to have a strong life experience with Jesus. Let the children pray much more, let them try to put the Word of God into practice in the smallest things.

## THE LITTLE STORY: SAINT CANUT IV



Once upon a time there was a little boy who loved the Lord very much. When he grew up, he became King of Denmark; as he had been a good boy, so he became a good king. He was brought up as a Christian and behaved like a good Christian and was different from other kings. Understanding that it is the duty of a prince to defend his subjects, he liked to practise his arms and soon became a master of the military art.

In battle he was the first and never retreated; placed, still young, at the head of the Danish armies, each of his battles was a victory. But it was on the throne that his qualities and virtues shone through. Canute understood that obedience to the eternal King and that the only true King was God and that he had to obey God faithfully and that the practice of the Gospel would earn him in Heaven.

The frugality of his table, for he did not eat like a king, but simply the simplicity of his clothing, made a striking contrast with the luxury of his court, for his subjects dressed more than he did. Nevertheless, he knew how

to make his dignity respected and to impose on all by his majesty and by the fear of his just authority. Here is an example: A Danish chief, in order to meet his insane expenses, was not ashamed to practice the criminal profession of pirate and brigand; one day the king of Denmark learned that his vessel had plundered a Norwegian ship and massacred the crew. He had the culprit seized, convinced him of the crime by his own confession and sentenced him to death without fear of the vengeance of his powerful family.

This just king was the most loyal of men, and his goodness of soul equalled his firmness. Austere and pious, like a monk, he fasted often, spent the nights in prayer, and had only one concern, that of spreading faith in his kingdom, understanding well that it is the true source of all progress and civilisation. Hell raised enemies to this holy king in the shadows; while he was praying in a church, he was surrounded by assassins, and rather than flee, he continued his prayer and allowed himself to be stabbed on his knees on the steps of the altar. God avenged his death by afflicting Denmark with many calamities, and miraculous healings took place at his tomb.
