CHILDREN'S PRAYERLEAFLET: THE JOY OF GOD (November 2023

The saints have shown great experience of the joy that God brings. The joy of living with God was so extraordinary in Saint Paul that nothing could stop him from following Christ. He gave up everything for Christ. He said: "For me, life is Christ". And then: "Now all those things that were gains for me I have considered a loss for Christ's sake. But yes, I consider everything a loss in the face of that supreme good which is the knowledge of Jesus my Lord. For his sake I have lost everything. I regard all things as rubbish, that I may gain Christ" (Phil 3:7-11).

Jesus wants children to be joyful, not just to play. The joys of the world, even if they do not lead to sin, are momentary. Yes, God is truly the source of deep joy. Joy is great and beautiful with him. That's why he insists that children follow him. Jesus said: "Let the little children come to me". This is the good news of Jesus. This month, let's pray and ask Jesus to let us experience his joy.

THE LITTLE STORY: Saint Martin de Porrès Religious of the Third Order of St Dominic (1579-1639).



This Saint was born in Lima, in South America. His father was a Spanish conqueror and his mother a black slave who had become free. As Martin was very similar to his mother in colour, he became a cause of humiliation for his father, who abandoned him to his fate. His admirable purity of morals, his modesty, his humility and his charity for the poor were the characteristic virtues of his childhood and throughout his life.

At the age of fifteen, Martin de Porrès entered the Third Order of St Dominic. The young novice loved humility. He called himself the greatest of sinners, kissed on his knees the feet of those who insulted him and begged them to trample him under their feet. His hatred for the smallest faults was implacable. To avoid them, Saint Martin de Porres constantly punished his body with fasts and iron chains. He loved Jesus so much that the strength of

this love one day made him rise from the ground, fly towards a crucifix and kiss the wound of the Heart of Jesus. He spoke only of God or with God, and poured out his divine love on all people, especially the sick and dying. This Saint of charity displayed his inexhaustible devotion in the nursing duties he was entrusted with.

Saint Martin de Porrès knew the secrets of hearts, foretold the future, revealed the tricks of demons and repelled their attacks with authority. He guessed at the distance desires of patients and transported miraculously to their bedside. During an epidemic which broke out at the convent of the Rosary, all the doors were kept closed. The patients were amazed to notice the presence of the Saint near their bed. Saint Martin de Porrès was heard and seen in Europe, in China, in Algeria, in Japan, manwhile he never left America. Though he had no background of religious studies, he solved the most serious questions of theology. God revealed to him in advance the day of his death. The Saint asked that all religious at the convent to be present at his last moments and asked them for forgiveness for all the offenses that he had committed towards them. His brothers recited the Apostles' Creed with emotion, and when they heard the words "The Word became flesh", Saint Martin de Porres gently placed the crucifix on his chest and returned his innocent soul to God at the age of sixty.
